LPIA - High Point, NC RESCUE 2015 REVIEW

We sometimes find ourselves going through the motions of day-to-day rescue tasks as if we're on auto pilot. We answer the phones and receive requests for financial aid to have a pet spayed or neutered, and we promptly arrange the surgery. We receive many daily calls from pet owners wishing to surrender their pets for various reasons: moving, new baby, allergies... This is what we do without fail every single day and sometimes question if we are really making a difference.

Then, a dog like Hershey comes along. A dog that has endured such suffering at the hands of those individuals meant to care for him. Hershey's life had been nothing but pain, and he was mad. He came to us suffering with severe burns that had been festering without any medical intervention. He would have immediately been euthanized at the shelter not only for his condition, but because he was also showing aggression. Rightfully so, we say! This is a dog that had been taught to not trust humans because we will certainly hurt him. Once he settled in, it was clear that he had never felt a kind hand or experienced affection in his life. He was hooked! Every dog with a sad before deserves the chance to have a happy after.

One of our biggest projects this year was a very unfortunate situation in Seagrove. Cases like this come with a renewed sense of urgency, reminding us that even though we have come so far for animals in North Carolina, there is still so much work to be done. There were 30 dogs at the property at the center of it all, none of which were spayed or neutered. Litters were born regularly with puppies being used as target practice by neighbors. Surviving pups were hairless and mangy from the stress. Zeb and Harper are just two of the dogs we rescued that were in poor condition. There were chained dogs on adjoining properties, all in poor health. We paid to spay/neuter all of the dogs and managed to negotiate the surrender of 13 to us. This was a massive undertaking due to lack of transportation by the owners. We made many trips to Seagrove to transport dogs back and forth to the vet, provided pet food and medical care, and convinced other neighbors to also have their dogs spayed.

Sadly, these more severe situations do arise and remind us that rescues are necessary. The suffering would be so much greater without individual groups willing to intervene for the helpless and voiceless. We continue to be grateful and humbled by the support we receive from our loyal supporters!
